TRAFFIC ADVISORY STATE ROUTE 99 FROM AUSTIN ROAD TO EIGHT MILE ROAD IN SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

San Joaquin County – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will perform various road construction and maintenance activities on State Route 99 (SR-99) from Austin Road to Eight Mile Road. No two consecutive ramps will close at the same time. Work will occur as follows:

- The on and off-ramps on northbound and southbound SR-99 from Austin Road to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard (formerly Charter Way) will alternately close beginning Monday, April 21, 2014, through Friday, April 25, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The eastbound connector ramp from SR-120 West/Manteca Bypass to southbound SR-99 will close beginning Monday, April 21, 2014, through Friday, April 25, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The #1 (left) lane, left shoulder and median on southbound SR-99 from Austin Road to SR-120 East/Yosemite Avenue will close beginning Monday, April 21, 2014, through Friday, April 25, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes on northbound and southbound SR-99 from Arch Road to SR-4/Crosstown Freeway will alternately close beginning Monday, April 21, 2014, through Friday, April 25, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The #1 (left) and #2 (middle) lanes on northbound SR-99 from SR-4/Crosstown Freeway to just north of Wilson Way will close beginning Monday, April 21, 2014, through Friday, April 25, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #1 (left) and #2 (middle) lanes on southbound SR-99 from Eight Mile Road to SR-26 East/Fremont Street will close beginning Monday, April 21, 2014, through Friday, April 25, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.
