TRAFFIC ADVISORY STATE ROUTE 99 FROM THE MADERA/MERCED COUNTY LINE TO THE MERCED/STANISLAUS COUNTY LINE

Merced County – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will perform various road construction and bridge activities on State Route 99 (SR-99) from the Madera/Merced County line to the Merced/Stanislaus County line. Work will occur as follows:

- The #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes on SR-99 from the Madera/Merced County line to the Merced/Stanislaus County line will alternately close beginning Monday, January 27, 2014, through Thursday, January 30, 2014, from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.;
- The northbound off-ramp from SR-99 to SR-140 (past Childs Avenue) will close beginning Monday, January 27, 2014, through Friday, January 31, 2014, from 7:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #2 (right) lane on SR-99 from Winton Parkway Overcrossing to the Merced River Bridge (before Collier Road) will close on Wednesday, January 29, 2014, from 9:00 a.m. until 2:30 p.m.;
- The northbound on-ramp from SR-140 near 15th Street to SR-99 is closed and scheduled to reopen May of 2014;
- The northbound off-ramp from SR-99 to SR-140 (near 16th Street) is closed and scheduled to reopen May of 2014;
- The southbound on-ramp from G Street to SR-99 is closed and scheduled to reopen May of 2014;
- The northbound off-ramp from SR-99 to G Street is closed and scheduled to reopen May of 2014;

- The eastbound connector ramp from SR-140 to SR-99/ near 17th Street (Main Street) is closed and scheduled to reopen May of 2014.

Crews also closed 15th Street under SR-99 on January 1, 2014, and the surface street is anticipated to reopen May of 2014.

Motorists should expect 15 minute delays. Alternate routes should be taken whenever possible.

Construction is scheduled to begin as listed, but is subject to change due to traffic incidents, weather, availability of equipment and/ or materials, and construction related issues.
