TRAFFIC ADVISORY INTERSTATE 5 FROM ROTH ROAD TO COUNTRY CLUB BOULEVARD IN SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

San Joaquin County – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will perform various road construction and maintenance activities on Interstate 5 (I-5) from Roth Road to Country Club Boulevard. No two consecutive ramps will close at the same time. Work will occur as follows: (No road work is scheduled on Thursday, November 27, 2014, and Friday, November 28, 2014)

- The #1(left) and #2 (middle) lanes on southbound I-5 at Roth Road will alternately close beginning Sunday, November 23, 2014, through Wednesday, November 26, 2014, from 8:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The #1(left) and #2 (middle) lanes on southbound I-5 at Mathews Road will close beginning Sunday, November 23, 2014, through Wednesday, November 26, 2014, from 8:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The northbound on-ramp from Downing Avenue to I-5 will close beginning Sunday, November 23, 2014, through Wednesday, November 26, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #1(left) and #2 (middle) lanes on northbound I-5 at Walker Slough will close beginning Sunday, November 23, 2014, through Wednesday, November 26, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #1 (left), #2 (middle) and #3 (right) lanes, and right shoulder on northbound and southbound I-5 from SR-4/Charter Way to Country Club Boulevard will alternately close beginning Sunday, November 23, 2014, through Wednesday, November 26, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The connector ramps at northbound and southbound I-5 and eastbound and westbound SR-4/Crosstown Freeway will alternately close beginning Sunday, November 23, 2014, through Wednesday, November 26, 2014, from 10:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.

Motorists should expect 10 minute delays. Alternate routes should be taken whenever possible.
