PERMANENT RAMP CLOSURES STATE ROUTE 99 AT DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. BOULEVARD/MAIN STREET AND FARMINGTON ROAD IN STOCKTON

Stockton – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will permanently close the following ramps:

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard: Southbound on and off-ramps: October 7, 2014

Farmington Road: Northbound on-ramp: October 7, 2014

Main Street northbound off-ramp: Early November 2014

DETOURS:

Southbound SR-99 to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard:

- Continue south past old exit;
- Take the new Golden Gate exit;
- Head west towards Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard to Northbound SR-99

- Straight on Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard;
- Right onto Golden Gate Avenue;
- Straight over the overcrossing;
- Left onto northbound SR-99 on-ramp.

Farmington Road to Northbound SR-99:

- Take New Golden Gate Avenue on-ramp.

Northbound SR-99 to Main Street:

- Take Farmington Road Exit;
- Head west on Farmington Road;
- Right onto Mariposa Road;
- Right onto Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard;
- Left onto Golden Gate Avenue towards Main Street.

The closure is scheduled to begin as listed, but is subject to change due to traffic incidents, weather, availability of equipment and/ or materials and construction related issues.

This closure is part of the SR-99 South Stockton Widening Project. The \$214.5 million project will widen SR-99 from four lanes to six lanes from Arch Road to SR-4. The project will build bridges; rebuild existing interchanges and permanently close some existing interchanges. The project when completed will ease congestion, improve mobility, decrease commute times and enhance safety within and through the county. Caltrans would like to extend our appreciation to motorists and residents for their cooperation during the construction of the SR-99 improvement project.
