### **TRAFFIC ADVISORY INTERSTATE 5 FROM DOWNEY AVENUE TO HAMMER LANE IN SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY**

**San Joaquin County** – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will perform various road construction and maintenance activities on Interstate 5 (I-5) from Downey Avenue to Hammer Lane. No two consecutive ramps will close at the same time. Work will occur as follows:

- The on-ramp from Downing Avenue to northbound I-5 will close beginning Sunday, October 19, 2014, through Friday, October 24, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #1(left) and #2 (middle) lanes on northbound I-5 at Walker Slough will close beginning Sunday, October 19, 2014, through Friday, October 24, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The #1 (left), #2 (middle) and #3 (right) lanes, and right shoulder on northbound and southbound I-5 from SR-4/Charter Way to Country Club Boulevard will alternately close beginning Sunday, October 19, 2014, through Friday, October 24, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The on and off-ramps on northbound and southbound I-5 from SR-4/Charter Way to Country Club Boulevard will alternately close beginning Sunday, October 19, 2014, through Friday, October 24, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The connector ramps at northbound and southbound I-5 and eastbound and westbound SR-4/Crosstown Freeway will alternately close beginning Sunday, October 19, 2014, through Friday, October 24, 2014, from 10:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The northbound on and off-ramps on I-5 from Alpine Avenue to Hammer Lane will alternately close beginning Sunday, October 19, 2014, through Friday, October 24, 2014, from 8:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.

Motorists should expect 10 minute delays. Alternate routes should be taken whenever possible.
