## **TRAFFIC ADVISORY INTERSTATE 5 FROM STANISLAUS/MERCED COUNTY LINE TO STANISLAUS/SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY LINE**

**Stanislaus County** – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will close various on and off-ramps and perform traffic control on Interstate 5 (I-5) from the Stanislaus/Merced County line to the Stanislaus/San Joaquin County line for striping. No two consecutive ramps will be closed. Work will occur as follows:

- On northbound I-5, various on and off-ramps will close and the #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes will alternately close beginning Monday, November 16, 2015, through Friday, November 20, 2015, from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.
- On southbound I-5, various on and off-ramps will close and the #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes will alternately close beginning Monday, November 16, 2015, through Friday, November 20, 2015, from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Motorists should expect 15 minute delays and seek alternate routes.

This work is scheduled to begin as listed, but is subject to change due to traffic incidents, weather, availability of equipment and/ or materials and construction related issues.

This is part of the Interstate 5 Repaving and Rehabilitation Project, a \$51 million effort that will repave 40 miles of I-5 in Merced, Stanislaus and San Joaquin counties. Work began in April 2015 and is scheduled to finish in April 2016. The project extends from Tom Paine Slough in San Joaquin County, just north of the I-205 interchange, to just south of the Merced/Stanislaus County line. The project also is installing in-ground detections loops and paving on and off-ramps so they conform smoothly with local roads.
