### CONSTRUCTION ADVISORY CALTRANS RESTRIPING ROAD, ADDING SAFETY FEATURES TO STATE ROUTE 4 IN STANISLAUS AND CALAVERAS COUNTY

**Stanislaus/Calaveras County** – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is preparing for a project that will restripe the road and add safety features to 16 miles of State Route 4 (SR-4) in Stanislaus and Calaveras counties.

The project is scheduled to begin the week of May 29, and be completed in June 2016, with no work scheduled for Memorial Day (May 30).

Crews are scheduled to work Sunday through Thursday nights, primarily from 7:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. Work will not begin on Sundays until 9:00 p.m. One-way traffic control will be used and drivers should expect 10 minute delays.

The project will include new striping and centerline rumble strips.

Rumble strips are designed to alert drivers when their vehicles leave their traffic lane. As tires pass over the rumble strips, drivers can hear the noise and feel the vibration produced by these rumble strips. These strips are ground into the pavement surface.

Workers also will replace reflective road markers and apply a fresh coat of paint to the in-road messages – such as Stop, Left Turn Only, etc. – where necessary.

Work will be performed at the following locations:

- From the Stanislaus/San Joaquin County line to the Stanislaus/Calaveras County line, a distance of nine miles.
- From the SR-4/SR-49 junction in Angels Camp to Davis Ranch Road in Calaveras County, a distance of seven miles.
