Highway 101 Wildlife Fencing Project

- Installed 2.5 miles of fencing on both sides of highway to direct animals to existing undercrossing
- Installed jump-outs (escape ramps)
- Installed electric mats for wildlife guards at local roadways entering the highway
- Monitor structures post-construction

Highway 46 East Widening to 4-Lanes

- Install wildlife exclusion fence and wildlife guards to prevent deer from entering the highway
- Install new large undercrossings for wildlife (1 bridge and culverts)
- Install smaller culvert undercrossings for kit fox
- Post-construction monitoring (Caltrans Biologist– Jen Moonjian)

It took about 4 years for deer to start using the new culvert undercrossing. This is why it is so important to include a minimum of 5 years of monitoring!
