Dear Contractor:

This addendum is being issued to the contract for CONSTRUCTION ON STATE HIGHWAY IN NEVADA COUNTY IN TRUCKEE AT DONNER CREEK UNDERPASS.

Submit bids for this work with the understanding and full consideration of this addendum. The revisions declared in this addendum are an essential part of the contract.

Bids for this work will be opened on Tuesday, April 20, 2010.

In the Special Provisions, Section 10-1, "ORDER OF WORK," the following paragraph is added after the sixth paragraph:

"Traffic Control is the protection system under conditions involving Temporarily Unprotected Permanent Obstacles. Removing metal beam guard railing and exposing the edge and face of the tunnel to traffic is a Temporarily Unprotected Permanent Obstacle until the construction of the structure concrete, barrier transition block and alternative crash cushion is complete or as approved by the Engineer."

In the Special Provisions, Section 10-1.035, "CONSTRUCTION SUPPORT FACILITIES," is added as attached.

To Bid book holders:

Inquiries or questions in regard to this addendum must be communicated as a bidder inquiry and must be made as noted in the Notice to Bidders section of the Notice to Bidders and Special Provisions.

Indicate receipt of this addendum by filling in the number of this addendum in the space provided on the signature page of the Bid book.

Submit bids in the Bid book you now possess. Holders who have already mailed their book will be contacted to arrange for the return of their book.

Inform subcontractors and suppliers as necessary.

10-1.35 CONSTRUCTION SUPPORT FACILITIES

Summary

This work includes temporary water pollution control practices associated with construction support facilities.

Submittals

At least 5 days before operating a construction support facility, submit:

1. A plan showing the location and quantity of temporary water pollution control practices associated with the construction support facility
2. If you operate a batch plant or crushing plant under the General Industrial Permit, submit a copy of:
 - 2.1. Notice of Intent (NOI) approved by the RWQCB
 - 2.2. Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) approved by the RWQCB

MATERIALS

Not used.

CONSTRUCTION

If you operate construction support facilities, then you must protect storm water systems or watercourses from the discharge of potential pollutants by using temporary water pollution control practices.

Temporary water pollution control practices include:

1. Soil stabilization
2. Sediment control and other perimeter controls
3. Tracking controls
4. Wind erosion controls
5. Storm drain inlet protection

Construction support facilities include:

1. Staging areas
2. Storage yards for equipment and materials
3. Mobile operations
4. Batch plants for PCC and HMA
5. Crushing plants for rock and aggregate
6. Other facilities installed for your convenience such as haul roads

If you operate a batch plant to manufacture PCC, HMA, or other material; or a crushing plant to produce rock or aggregate; then you must obtain coverage under the Industrial General Permit. You must be covered under the General Industrial Permit for batch plants and crushing plants located:

1. Outside of the jobsite
2. Within the jobsite that serve one or more contracts

Discharges from manufacturing facilities such as batch plants must comply with the general waste discharge requirements for Order No. 97-03-DWQ, NPDES General Permit No. CAS000001, issued by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) for "Discharge of Stormwater associated with industrial activities excluding construction activities". This General Industrial Permit is available at:

The Department does not pay for temporary water pollution control practices installed at construction support facilities.
