Ref: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

ISSUE:

The facilities in the relinquishment resolutions summarized below are safe and drivable or have been maintained in a state of good repair. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the California Transportation Commission (Commission) meeting for both superseded highways and collateral facilities pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Department of Transportation recommends the Commission approve the following Relinquishment Resolutions:

Resolution No. R-3580 – 04-CC-4-PM 0.4 (Request No. 40430) – 3 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the City of Hercules, along Sycamore Avenue and Palm Avenue, from the easterly city limit to Willow Avenue and along Willow Avenue to about 0.1 mile north of State Route 4, consisting of superseded highway right of way, reconstructed and relocated city streets and cul-de-sacs. The City, by freeway agreement dated August 30, 1961, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State and by resolution dated April 13, 2004, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State.

Resolution No. R-3581 – 12-Ora-1-PM 14.1/17.4 (Request No. R120010) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes a portion of Route 1 right of way in the City of Newport Beach, from Newport Coast Drive to Jamboree Road, under terms and conditions as stated in the cooperative agreement dated May 4, 2004, determined to be in the best interest of the State. Authorized by Chapter 825, Statutes of 2001, which added Section 301.5 to the Streets and Highways Code.
