SUBJECT: FY 2009 FTIP Amendment No. 8 – Madera County Transportation Commission (MCTC)

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) have completed the review of Amendment No. 8 to the MCTC Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) that was submitted by your letter dated May 6, 2009. MCTC adopted Amendment No. 8 on April 22, 2009. This amendment to MCTC's 2008/09 FTIP includes:

- Programs \$17,000 of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Recovery Act) FTA Section 5307 funds in FY 2008/09 and \$34,000 in FY 2009/10 for MAD213082 MAX Preventative Maintenance.
- Programs \$35,000 of Recovery Act FTA Section 5307 funds in FY 2008/09 and \$71,000 in FY 2009/10 for MAD213083 DAR Preventative Maintenance.
- Reduces Recovery Act FTA Section 5307 funds on MAD213072 by \$29,000 in FY 2008/09.
- Adds \$1,574,000 of Recovery Act Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) funds, and \$60,000 of local measure funds to project MAD420002 in FY 2008/09 for local streets and roads rehabilitation.
- Programs \$97,000 of Recovery Act Transportation Enhancement funds and \$103,000 of local transportation funds in FY 2008/09 for project MAD115001, Oakhurst Sidewalks.

Pursuant to the July 15, 2004, *Memorandum of Understanding between the Federal Highway Administration, California Division, and the Federal Transit Administration, Region IX*, we accept the modifications to the 2008/09 – 2011/12 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP) for the MCTC region in accordance with the Final Rule on Statewide and Metropolitan Transportation Planning published in the February 14, 2007 Federal Register. We find that the MCTC's 2008/09 FTIP, through Amendment No. 8, was developed through a continuing, cooperative and comprehensive transportation planning process carried out in accordance with the metropolitan planning provisions of 23 U.S.C. 134, and 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53 as amended by Section 6001 of Public Law 109-59, the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU).

We have determined that this program modification is exempt from the regional emissions analysis requirements pursuant to the transportation conformity provisions found in 40 CFR Part 93. This finding has been coordinated with Region 9 of the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in accordance with the procedures outlined in the *National Memorandum of Understanding between DOT and EPA on Transportation Conformity*, dated April 25, 2000. Therefore, we find that the FTIP continues to conform to the applicable State Implementation Plan (SIP).

Based on our review of the lists of projects proposed for Recovery Act funding, we recommend that MCTC encourage the local agencies in the region to work closely with the Caltrans District Local Assistance Engineer (DLAE) to ensure the proposed Recovery Act projects listed in the FTIP/FSTIP are on located on a Federal-aid highway, specifically a highway or highways eligible for assistance under Chapter 1 of 23 U.S.C. other than highways classified as a local road or rural minor collector.

This approval is provided with the understanding that the FTA funding approval on the individual projects contained in the FSTIP are subject to grantees meeting all necessary FTA administrative requirements, and that approval of this programming action does not provide a federal eligibility determination for CMAQ projects or any other project funding source included in this amendment.
