Dear Mr. Hannon and Mr. Sukys:

With this letter, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) transmits Administrative Modification No. 20 to the Rural non-Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) area portion of the California 2013 Federal Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (FSTIP). This modification reduces the programming capacity by \$6.3 million. The financial plan will be updated to reflect this change in the next formal amendment.

FSTIP Modification #20 amends the following existing projects in the 2013 FSTIP:

State, Local and Transit Elements

Various Counties:

Proj #1: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0159, Grouped Project Listing for Safety Improvement – Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) – increases the funding by \$2.179 million for the current FSTIP period (FY 12/13 to FY 15/16).

Proj #2: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0143, Grouped Project Listing for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) 5310 Program – modifies the funding and adds three new projects on the detailed backup listing totaling \$245,000.

Proj #3: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0320, Grouped Project Listing for State Highway Operation and Protection Program (SHOPP) Minor Program – reduces the total funding by \$4.8 million and revises the detailed backup listing.

Proj #4: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0395, Grouped Project Listing for Activities that do not lead to Construction – Statewide Highway Bridge Program (HBP) Plans and Studies – modifies funding between FYs consistent with Caltrans November 15, 2013 HBP listing update.

Proj #5: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0031, Grouped Project Listing for Bridge Rehabilitation and Reconstruction – Local HBRR non-capacity increasing – reduces the funding by \$5.4 million for the current FSTIP period; revises the detailed backup listing consistent with Caltrans November 15, 2013 HBP lump-sum listing update.

Proj #6: CTIPS ID 230-0000-0029, Grouped Project Listing for Emergency Repair – SHOPP Emergency Response – modifies the funding and adds one new project on the detailed backup listing totaling \$1.4 million in FY 13/14.

Lassen County:

Proj #7: CTIPS ID 130-0000-1947, Riverside Drive reconstruction and construction of Class 1 Bike-Pedestrian – reduces the funding by \$60,000 and modifies the fund source and delivery schedule.

Amador County:

Proj 8-9: Modifies delivery schedule of 2 individually listed HBP projects. No change in total project cost.

Calaveras County:

Proj 10-19: Modifies delivery schedule of various individually listed HBP projects. No change in total project cost.

Inyo County:

Proj 20-21: Modifies delivery schedule of two individually listed HBP projects. No change in total project cost.

Mariposa County:

Proj 22-29: Modifies delivery schedule of various individually listed HBP projects. No change in total project cost.

Nevada County:

Proj 30: Modifies delivery schedule of one individually listed HBP projects. No change in total project cost.

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Toulumne County:

Proj 31-36: Modifies funding and delivery schedule of various individually listed HBP projects.

These changes are consistent with the FSTIP Amendment and Administrative Modification Procedures and have no impact on the rural non-MPO financial constraint or air quality conformity. In addition, there are no projects in this administrative modification that are included in any other amendment that is currently open for public review.

Since administrative modifications do not require Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and/or Federal Transit Administration (FTA) approval, these changes have been incorporated into California's 2013 FSTIP.
